Alcohol and Other Drugs Work

205

Relevant activities and case studies focus on the importance of consulting with others, sharing ideas and considering different points of view when working with drugs and alcohol.



Youth Work

301

Designed for vocational workers in the community services sector covering a range of services from community action/development to health related work and acute care.



Disability and Mental Health

The learner will need to gather information and experience - both on and off-line - to complete the tasks in this simulated community centre.



Policy, Research and Advocacy

These resources reflect real-life situations and have a strong focus on research skills, aiming to give the learner a variety of ways to acquire knowledge for the Certificate IV and Diploma.



Grange Care Services

602

The learner is cast in the role of a care worker, and is presented with a typical range of tasks in either a residential facility or a home and community care environment.
